#### **Parks Foundation Internship**

The American Canyon Community & Parks Foundation (Parks Foundation) is a local non-profit that supports youth and the environment through education, conservation, and meaningful outdoor experiences. With funding from the Gasser Foundation grant, ACCPF will be able to extend two employment opportunities to High School seniors or first year College students that have participated in the teen leadership program called Teen WILD (Wilderness Inspired Leadership & Development). ACCPF's Teen WILD launched in 2021 and has fostered relationships with more than 60 local teens to bring community nature & environmental education programs to local trails. These civic-minded teens have committed over 1,000 volunteer hours, developed mentorship skills, and participated in community and education programs. The Gasser Foundation internship supports expansion of Foundation programs while providing vital real life work experience for local youth.

Interns will be paid a stipend of \$20 per hour.

The anticipated internship terms are June 2025- June 2026 with the possibility of continuation through June 2026.

The Environmental Education Interns will be asked to work up to 30 hours a month to support the following programs:

# Outdoor Connection Trailside Learning Center programming

*Responsibilities include*: scheduling quarterly Discovery Days community programs, reserving trails, developing marketing materials, providing input on planned educational activities, assist with set, provide set up/breakdown, provide educational support to community members, mentoring support for youth at planned NVUSD summer programs

## • Teen WILD Facilitator

*Responsibilities include*: Mentoring new participants, supporting ACCPF in planning & implementing quarterly teen training events, support Teen WILD committees by serving as note taker, research & implement committee planned conservation, education, and community activities, provide marketing support for planned events

## • Watershed Explorers & Mini Watershed Explorers Assistant

*Responsibilities include*: Providing field day support of educational activities, mentor youth on planned environmental education topics, assist with youth nature walks, manage communication with environmental partners, assist Education Director in planning & implementing classroom visits.

## Middle School Environmental Education Program

*Responsibilities include*: Providing field day support in set up/break down of educational activities, mentor students on planned environmental education topics, assist with conservation activities

#### • Conservation Days and Special Events

*Responsibilities include*: Providing field day support, organizing equipment, guiding volunteer activities, leading wetlands restoration activities

## • Capstone Projects:

With support from Parks Foundation staff, interns will work together to identify a need, then plan, implement, and evaluate a special environmental project that utilizes skills learned throughout the year

Skills and work experience that students will acquire during their internships with the Parks Foundation:

- Learn to develop, prepare, lead and evaluate, educational and interpretive programs in an outdoor, natural environment
- Develop an understanding of office policies and procedures
- Learn education, interpretive, and presentation skills
- Prepare classroom materials, set-up, and clean classroom spaces
- Develop career and professional skills with feedback, evaluation, and guidance from supervisors
- Increase understanding of plant and animal biology of the Napa River watershed
- Work alongside experienced environmental education professionals in a supportive environment
- Cultivate interpersonal skills working with volunteers, families, and students of diverse ages and backgrounds
- Develop marketing skills including design, branding, social media, and press release creation
- Develop an understanding of program safety and ensure safety of participants
- Safely use, maintain, and organize all supplies, equipment, and facilities
- Commit to accessibility, equity, and inclusion for a diverse community of students of all ages
- Lead by example and serve as a role model for environmental literacy and stewardship
- Perform all Naturalist Intern duties and tasks as assigned
